Making Conservation Retail Real: Successful National Event

The national meeting, **Making Conservation Retail Real**, was held in Des Moines in February. The twoday event brought together more than 100 leaders in ag retail and conservation from across the country to advance conservation agronomy in the private sector.

The meeting included fast-paced presentations from more than 20 speakers as well as small group discussions about the current state of agricultural conservation and why it is important to advance ag conservation. Speakers and attendees shared ideas on scaling-up conservation adoption through innovative ways that could be done in Iowa as well as across the country.

To launch the discussions, key guest speakers included Iowa Deputy Secretary of Agriculture Grant Menke, and Robert Bonnie, USDA Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation. They shared their thoughts on the need for conservation and how ag retailers have an important role in increasing conservation.

"The goal of this initial meeting is to begin the thought process of scaling up conservation in agriculture — finding our true North," says Roger Wolf, ACWA Executive Director. "We need the stakeholders that were at the meeting as well as new ones, including those not directly involved in agriculture, to actually make Retail Conservation Real."
